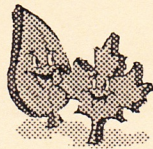

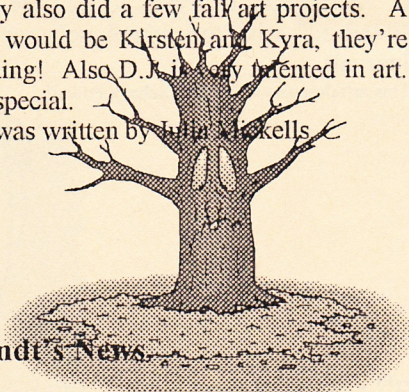

Miss Brandt's News

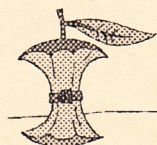

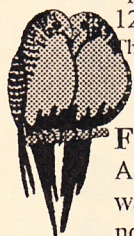
3rd Grade News

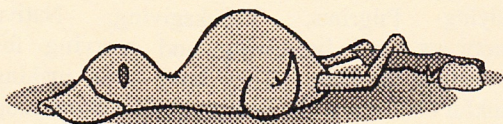

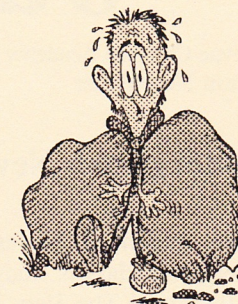
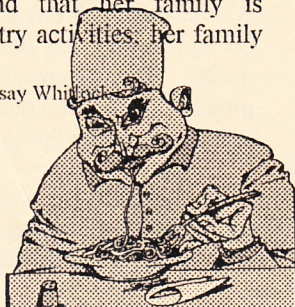

glad and start practicing for next year.

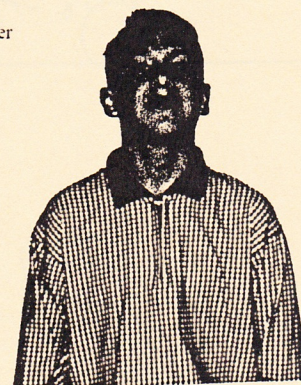

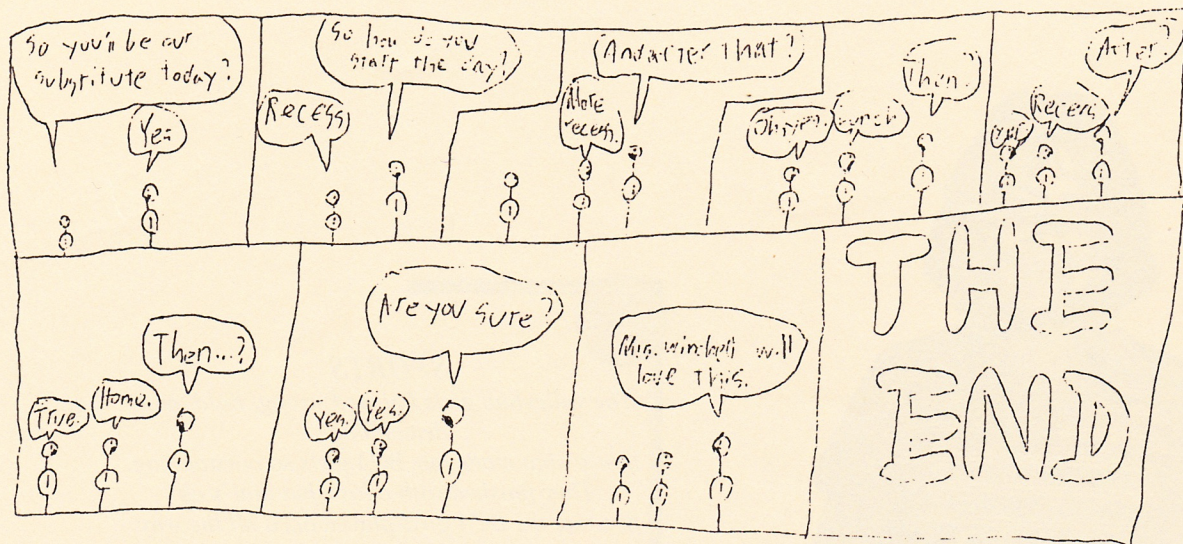


RICHARD

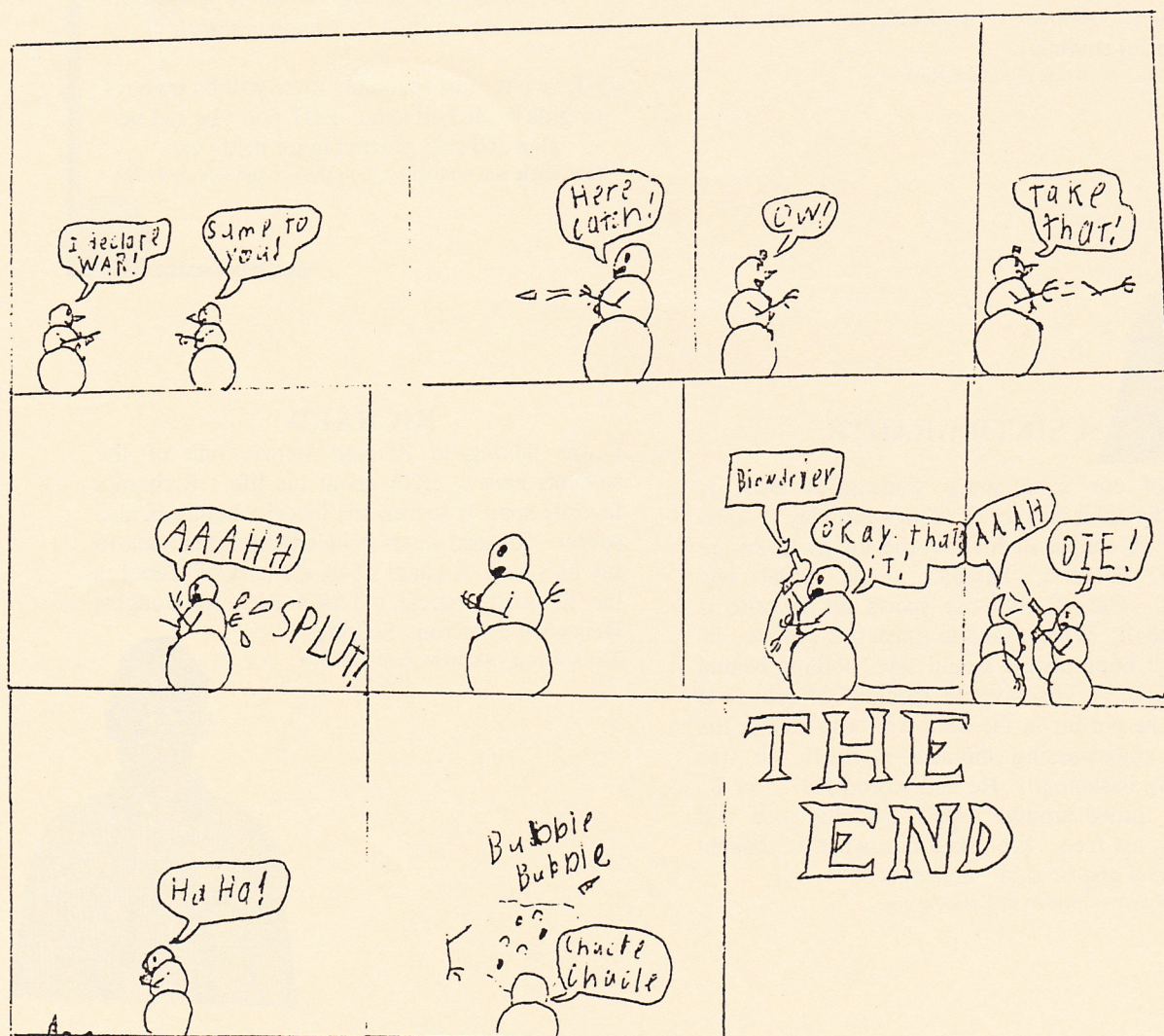


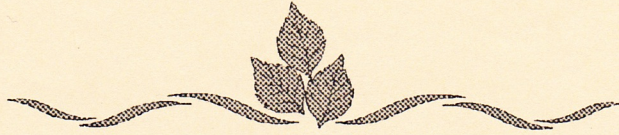
