

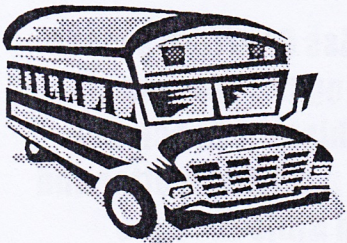

Next month Mrs. Huntoon is planning to be teaching on the rain forest and

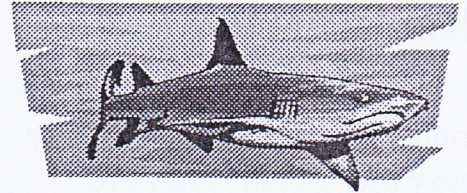

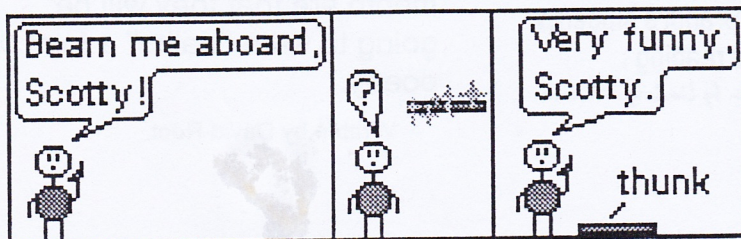
Her class is going to do a shark report and they're going ice skating. Miss Janssen has a very happy and exciting class.

Miss Goertzen's class is studying the Westward move in history. In science they are studying matter and atoms. In Bible they are learning about David.

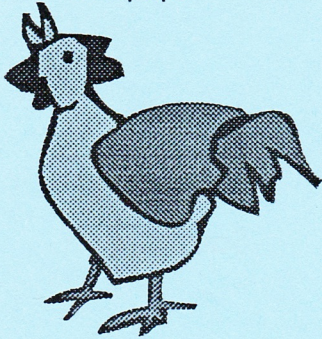
Last month they did a lot of neat stuff like making clay models and even seeing live chickens that Kyle brought in.

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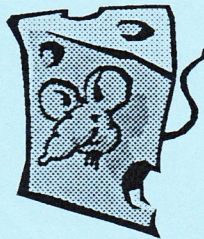

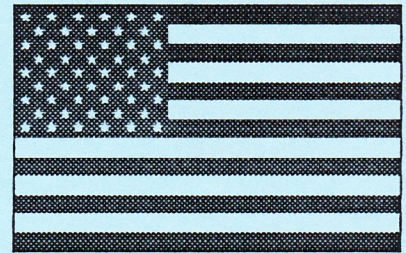

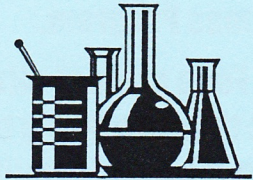
The 7th grade has been very busy learning physics. They even started "exploration stations." At the stations there are different exciting experiments

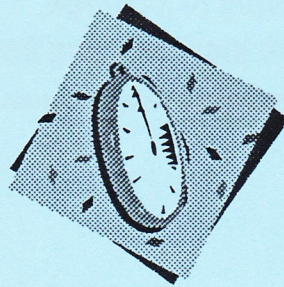

She is also an outstanding sixth grade student. So that's all for Michelle Morehead.

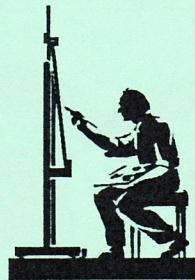

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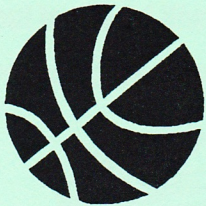
