

Jeremiah 29:11







Interim Opportunities

This year Concordia held its second annual Interim. What exactly is Interim?

Interim is a three-day period when students can choose to take one or two classes outside of their normal studies. During Interim students experience unique activities and challenges not a part of their normal classes.

The classes offered were; Cinema-ography, Humane Society, Extreme Competition Sports, Film Festival, Sign Language, Beading/Jewelry Making, Pottery, Soccer your Socks Off, City Slickers II (or horse back riding and three days on a ranch), Sound Engineering, Card Games Galore, Around the World in Three Days (cooking), Chi Town (a trip to Chicago), Laser Tag,

Scrapbooking, On the Ropes, All About Birds, Make a Quilt, Adventures In Photography, and Car Audio and Alarm.






























Go My Children...


